

Oakwood: We will host our first ever Curbside Book Fair. We had four teachers present at the curriculum conference in which they discussed variety of digital tools needed for a successful school year. Ms. Lingerfelt and Mrs. Rohr have welcomed two new additions to their families. Congratulations to our new Blue Jays! Our Oakwood News Crew have hit the ground running and students are excited to watch the morning announcements everyday! Oakwood students are participating in Unity Day all week long by wearing orange on A days, B days, and remote days. We celebrated our school's commitment to stand up against bullying and stand united for kindness, acceptance, and inclusion.

Southwest: Kim Holt (Kindergarten Remote Learning Teacher) received another Donors Choose for online learning.6 teachers from Southwest Primary presented in the HPS Curriculum Conference on topics ranging from Bitmoji Classrooms to Creating Cultural Awareness in the classroom. Mrs. Anderson's class received an Amazon Gift Card for \$200 to use towards classroom instruction and supplies.
